# Heber Carss Jamieson, M.B. F.R.C.P.(C)

January 28, 1879 - February 20, 1962.

Heber Jamieson was born in Almonte, Ontario, and received his medical degree from the University of Toronto in 1901. Post graduate work was carried out at the University of London, England, where he became a Member of the Royal College of Surgeons and a Licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians.

He came to Edmonton in 1911 to join the staff of the Provincial Laboratory, and with the establishment of the Faculty of Medicine at the University in the fall of 1913, he became a part-time instructor in basic medical sciences. In 1914, when Dr. A. C. Rankin, the newly appointed Provincial Bacteriologist and Director of the Provincial Laboratory, left on military service overseas, Dr. Jamieson assumed his duties on a temporary basis for the next five years. Appointed Lecturer in Medicine in 1920 and Associate Professor two years later, he was made Professor of the History of Medicine in 1925.

In addition to his University lectures and clinics, Dr. Jamieson conducted a private practice in internal medicine where his specialized treatment of diabetic patients gained recognition not only for the excellent results obtained, but also because the methods used were far in advance of the times. In 1943 he was promoted to the rank of Professor of Clinical Medicine and although he retired from the University on October 5, 1946, his long association with the institution was continued in his being named Honorary Professor of that department. He retired from private practice in 1950, and died in Edmonton on February 20, 1962.

Heber Jamieson married Florence Lyon of the Ottawa Valley region sometime before World War I, and they had two daughters, one of whom is still living in Edmonton. In the course of his career, Dr. Jamieson wrote one book, Early Medicine in Alberta, The First Seventy-Five Years, and numerous articles that were originally prepared for delivery at medical meetings but were later published in provincial or national journals. Their theme is the development of medical facilities within the province, with special emphasis on doctors who were in the area before 1910, and on early hospitals and nursing care. He collaborated with Dr. Robert K. Gordon of the Department of English at the University in the production of an adventure story for boys, entitled In the Grip of the Barren Lands which was published in the 1920s or early 1930s.

#### THE HEBER C. JAMIESON PAPERS 1861 - 1961

The textual and photographic records in the Heber C. Jamieson collection represent the research material gathered by Dr. Jamieson for use in speeches or in his published works on the history of medicine in Alberta. They consist of correspondence, articles in typed or published form, bound volumes of the history and minutes of University medical clubs, news clippings, publications and photographs, which cover the period 1861 to 1961.

The papers were found in a storage room in the old Medical Sciences Building and were deposited in the Archives in 1981. The material that had been added after Dr. Jamieson's death in 1962 and other items that had no relevance to the history of medicine were transferred to the Faculty of Medicine collection. Except for nine alphabetically arranged files of biographical information on pioneer doctors and nurses, the greater part of the collection, although in labelled folders, was in no apparent order. On closer examination it became apparent that in many cases the relationship between doctor or nurse and hospital, or doctor or nurse and association or organization was so closely intermingled that separation into distinct groups would be impossible. It was decided, therefore, to separate the collection into textual records and photographic records, to consolidate, where possible, similar subjects within these two series, and to create an index which would serve as a finding aid to the information on people, institutions and organizations contained in both series. Dr. Jamieson's articles have been listed separately with their reference numbers, following the index.

The textual records pertain chiefly to pioneers in the medical field who spent at least part of their lives in Alberta, and to the places and institutions with which they were associated. There are, however, some typed or printed records outlining the careers of medical practitioners in western and northern Canada during the 19th century, as well as histories of medical schools or associations in British Columbia, Manitoba, and Quebec. The oldest document is a printed booklet dated 1861, and although there are other items originating in the same century, the majority of the papers were created between 1900 and 1947.

The 311 photographs in the second series, covering the period between 1883 and 1959, are mainly of pioneer doctors and early nursing and medical students. There are, as well, photos of doctors' offices, hospitals and nursing homes throughout the province, and of people and street scenes in Edmonton, Strathcona, Calgary, Lethbridge, Wetaskiwin, Camrose, Bellevue and other Alberta locations in the latter part of the last century or the first quarter of the present one.
