Description of the Papers

This accession continues and completes the deposits of personal papers which Dr. Wonders placed in the University Archives from 1973 to 1988. Research projects and professional activities to 1989 are presented here. In particular, Dr. Wonders' extensive research files on Scandinavian settlement in Alberta and on Scottish forestry have been completed and deposited. Items of memorabilia include certificates and other evidence of awards and honours.

Significance of the Papers

Dr. Wonders was the first professor of Geography at the University of Alberta. He established the department and was its Chair from 1957 to 1967. He is now a University Professor, with continuing research privileges at the University. He was one of the founders of the Boreal Institute for Northern Studies, and Chair of its Directorate for its first two years (1960-1962). He has done extensive teaching, writing, and research on northern issues, including Dene land claims, specialized atlases, and Scandinavian studies.

The papers cover matters important to the "top of the world", and will be of interest and use to geographers, historians, social scientists, and political scientists.
